SOLUTION

NWTAAC worked with management to review and advise on a strategy to improve operations and target high end, quality-oriented segments.

Investment

NWTAAC secured approval for \$150,000 for outside expertise with the company matching at 50% (\$75,000). The company invested substantial additional funds to fully implement the strategy.

RESULTS

TAAF focused on marketing and processing capability. This non-profit organization expanded the range of operations and substantially improved marketing. The firm employed \$34,173 of TAAF assistance over 7 years.


